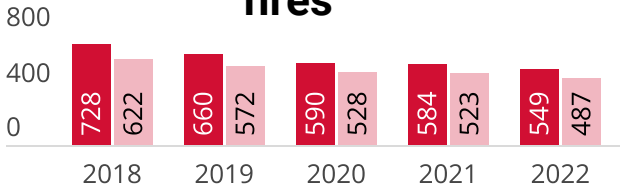
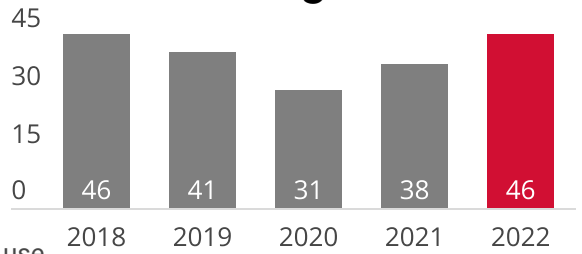


# RESIDENTIAL BUILDING FIRES IN 2022

## Deaths resulting from residential building fires



**There were 39 residential building fires in 2022, which claimed a total of 46 victims. In addition, there were two cases in which 2 people died in fires in the outdoors.**

## Profile of the typical victim of a fire

**REIN**  
AGE: 65+

**WORK**  
Unemployed: early retirement, disability, pension, financial aid

**PLACE OF RESIDENCE**  
An apartment building with 8 or more apartments, private residence, or social housing

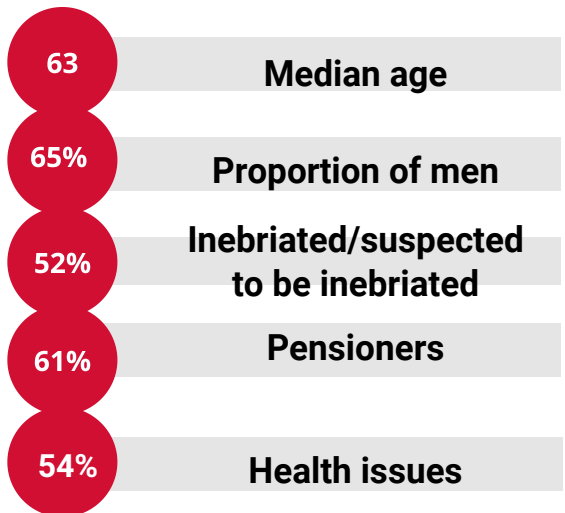
**HOUSEHOLD**  
Lives alone. If he does have children, they do not live with him, and have probably fallen out of touch with him. If he had a wife, they no longer live together, or she has died.

**FREE TIME**  
Crosswords, sports, whodunits.

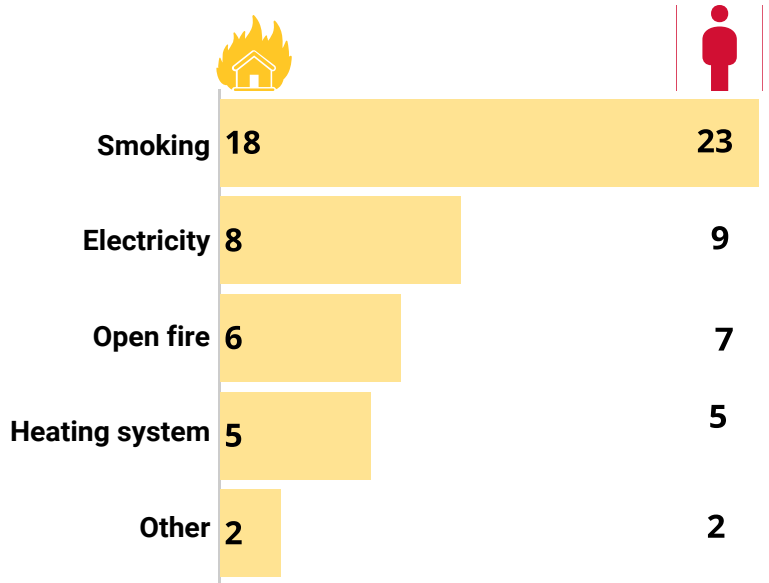
**MEDIA**  
TV, social media

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION**  
Focus: the main role models and information providers are friends (other Reins).  
Risk behaviour: consumes alcohol, smokes, hoards things in his living space.  
Health restrictions: various mental and physical problems (alcoholism, depression, dementia, lack of exercise).

## The causes of residential building fires that claimed victims and the number of victims



**The most common cause is reckless smoking.**

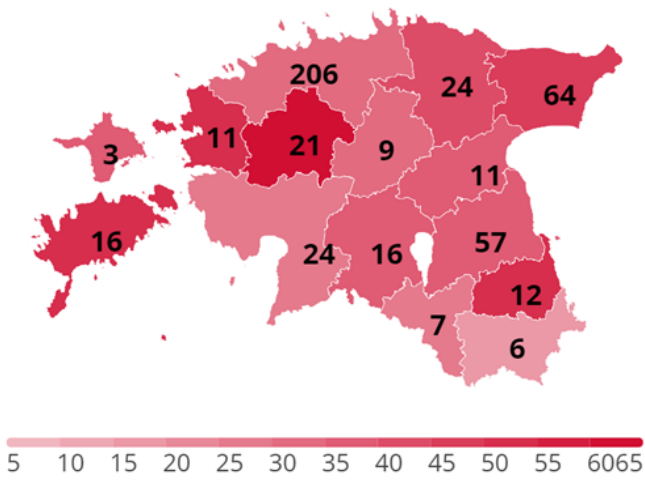
**There were 60 residential building fires in which 76 people were injured.**

**Only 9 homes, or 23% out of all residential building fires that claimed victims, had a working smoke detector.**



**The primary aid with life-saving capability reached residential building fires that claimed victims in an average of 11 minutes and 12 seconds.**

## Fires in occupied and partially occupied residential buildings by county

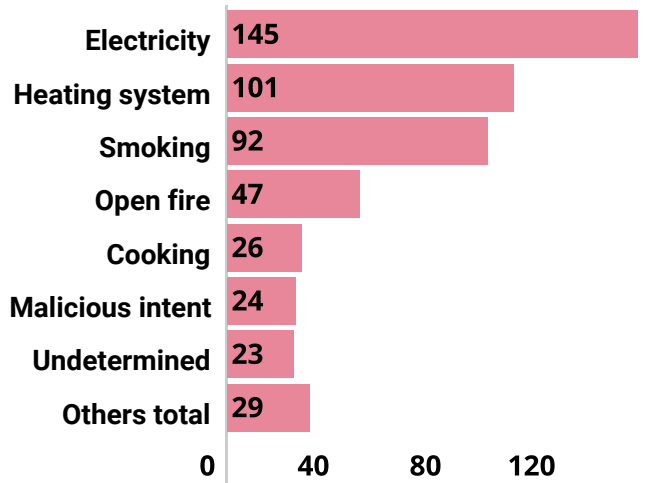


Number: the absolute number of residential building fires / Colour: ratio per 100,000 inhabitants

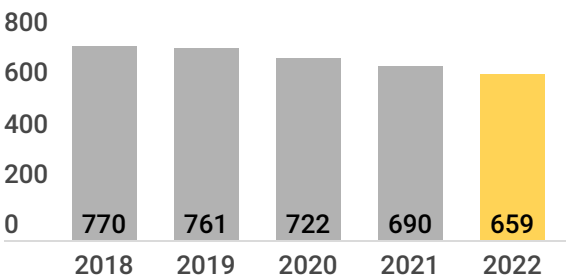
**Fires in occupied and partially occupied residential buildings caused property damage of 5 million euros. The value of property saved was 21.2 million euros.**

**34,5% of the residential buildings had a working smoke detector.**
